

JSC 2006 Summer Tournaments: Highlights & Headlines

State Cup

JSC fielded six teams at the 2006 State Cup tournament in Wasilla posting an overall record of eight wins, nine losses and five ties. Four boys teams (JD Thunder U13B, Jambaars U14B, JD United U15B and Riptide U17B) and two girls teams (Storm U13G and Ice Devils U14) represented Juneau at the Alaska showcase.
