

## **2010 JDHS State Tournament Results**

### **Boys are State Champions and girls' team ties for 3<sup>rd</sup> place**

Congratulations to the JDHS boy's and girl's varsity teams for their strong performances at the 2010 State Tournament here in Juneau, May 27-29.

The girls tied for 3<sup>rd</sup> place while posting a 1-1-1 record in tournament play. They opened the tournament with a convincing 3-0 victory over Wasilla, then lost a hard fought contest in the semifinals to eventual state champion Dimond by a 1-0 score. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> place game they came from behind twice to tie West Valley 2-2 and cap a very successful 16-5-2 varsity season record. The girls' varsity also sports an impressive 3.67 cumulative grade point average.

The boys captured the State Championship with a 2-1 victory over Dimond in the final. In the semifinals, they defeated Colony HS 1-0 in a very exciting double overtime game. They kicked off their tournament with a 3-1 win over Wasilla in the quarterfinals. For the second year in a row the team also won the boys' tournament academic award with a 3.52 cumulative grade point average. The boys' overall varsity season record was 21-1-4.

In addition to those team accomplishments, seven JDHS players were recognized for outstanding play by selection to the 2010 All Tournament Teams: Annika Ord, Ashley Soto, and Sarah Tarver for the girls and Philip Murray, Max Smith, Riley Paul, and Taylor Lehnhart for the boys. Shawnee Good and Ashley Soto won the girls' Good Sport Award. George Skan and Cole Lendrum won the Good Sport Award for the boys.

Thanks to coaches Gary Lehnhart, Matt Dusenberry, Sandy Wagner, Jer Gleason, Luke Adams and the rest of the JDHS staff and the Goal Keepers Club parent booster club for all of their efforts in supporting these student athletes on and off the pitch.

Nearly all members of the JDHS team are JSC members and we continue to be very proud of the JDHS soccer program and the high level of play and good sportsmanship exhibited by our players.
